

# Residential ESS cost breakdown in Netherlands 2025

Will housing prices rise in the Netherlands in 2025?

The Dutch housing market is poised for a substantial surge in costs in 2025, with both home prices and rental rates expected to rise sharply. Homebuyers could face a 7.5% increase in property prices, while rental costs may climb by up to 7.7%, making housing in the Netherlands even more challenging to afford.

How much will rent increase in the Netherlands next year?

Residents living in rental housing in the Netherlands will face substantial rent increases next year, whether their home is from the private sector or on the social housing market. Homes from the middle segment will see the steepest rise of about 8 percent, according to finalized figures published by the Dutch government on Tuesday night.

What is the average rent in the Netherlands in 2024?

The average rent price in the Netherlands was EUR17.04 per m<sup>2</sup> in the fourth quarter of 2024. For a 77 m<sup>2</sup> apartment, that means EUR1,312 per month, and for a 116 m<sup>2</sup> house EUR1,976. In the social rental sector, the average monthly rent is lower, around EUR560. How are rent prices determined in the Netherlands?

Why are social housing rents rising in the Netherlands?
